The Fayette County Board of Developmental Disabilities takes promoting a "Good Life" serious when working with people who receive services. We feel that everyone deserves to live the life they desire. To help people achieve a "good life", it takes everyone who is in the person's life to believe in and be a part of supporting a person in leading their life in the direction that they choose.

While the FCBDD has been focused on promoting a "positive culture"

within the organization and in interactions with people we serve and all stakeholders, we are making a commitment to fully embrace the "Good Life". Two staff from the Fayette County Board of Developmental Disabilities have been selected with high recommendations to go through an extensive training to be "Good Life" Facilitators. The staff that have been selected are Cheryl Binegar, a Service and Support Administrator, and Tony Clay, a Program Coordinator. This training, the "Good Life Ally and Coach Facilitator Learning Experience" is through the Ohio Association for County Boards of Developmental

Disabilities, who work closely with the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities and with local County Boards of DD, to provide support and training.

Once the "Good Life" Facilitators have completed the training, they will be qualified to use their toolbox of skills to train staff, stakeholders, and people we serve on what a "Good Life" is. The Fayette County Board's focus will be to view each person individually, and do what it takes to respectfully give people the direction and opportunities to achieve what we all desire in life, and that is to simply have a "Good Life!"

Employment First

The Fayette County Board of DD has been chosen as one of six pilot sites in the state of Ohio for the Employment First Initiative. Employment First was created as a result of an Executive Order by Governor Kasich and is a priority within Ohio to give individuals access to services and supports to work in competitive jobs within community.
