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# HOME AND COMMUNITY BASED WAIVER SERVICES



#### **HOME AND COMMUNITY BASED WAIVER SERVICES**

Home and Community Based Waiver Services are part of the Ohio Medicaid Waiver Program with approximately 40% of the funding coming from the County Board. The purposes of these



services are to support eligible persons to live and participate in their community instead of institutional settings. This includes persons living in their family home, or in their own home or apartment. This program has continued to expand and offers great opportunity to

people with disabilities. Additionally, a waiver is a cost effective way of serving persons receiving Supported Living Funding (local money) and Adult Day Services. Most counties in the state of Ohio, including Fayette County, have completed the refinancing of these situations. Currently, the Fayette County Board is administering approximately 97 total waivers, which the Service and Support Administration Division is responsible for.

#### **Types of Waivers**

**Level One:** Maximum yearly cost of \$5000

Individual Options: Begins at \$5001 and costs can go as high as identified needs require or assets allow.

# What Services are provided by a Waiver?

Homemaker Personal Care, Respite, Transportation, Home Modifications, Specialized Adaptive Equipment, Home Delivered Meals, Interpreter Services, and other approved services.





## Eligibility for Waiver Services

An Individual, of any age, could qualify for Waiver Services. Eligibility requirements include: Medicaid eligible and meet an ICFMR Level of Care.

## Who Administers the Waivers?

The Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities administers both waivers. The Fayette County Board, through SSA, is responsible for the completion of application packets, redeterminations, service planning, and implementation of services and monitoring of services.
